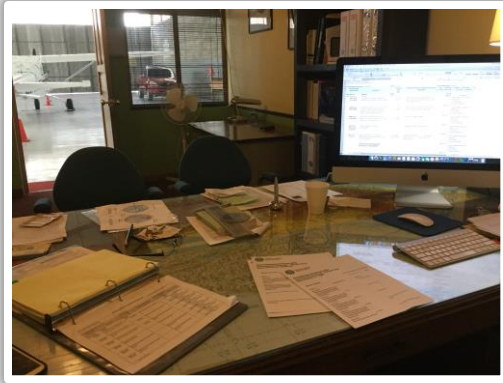


Years of Sweetness Ahead
